System Infrastructure – Defining and selecting information systems to achieve streamlined eligibility screening and enrollment, system-wide exchange of information and development of data repositories.

### **Expanding Coverage for Uninsured Populations**

Public/private Partnerships – Building alliances among employers, providers, communities, and public entities to fully utilize existing programs and develop creative solutions to extend coverage to more people.

Financing Coverage – Developing sustainable financing strategies recognizing limited public and private resources

### **Strengthening the Safety Net**

Capacity Analysis – Defining the components of the health care safety net, their roles and relationships, and their ability to provide access to under served populations in order to ensure that the safety net achieves its full potential.

Federally Qualified Health Centers – Assisting in developing and strengthening this valuable community resource.
