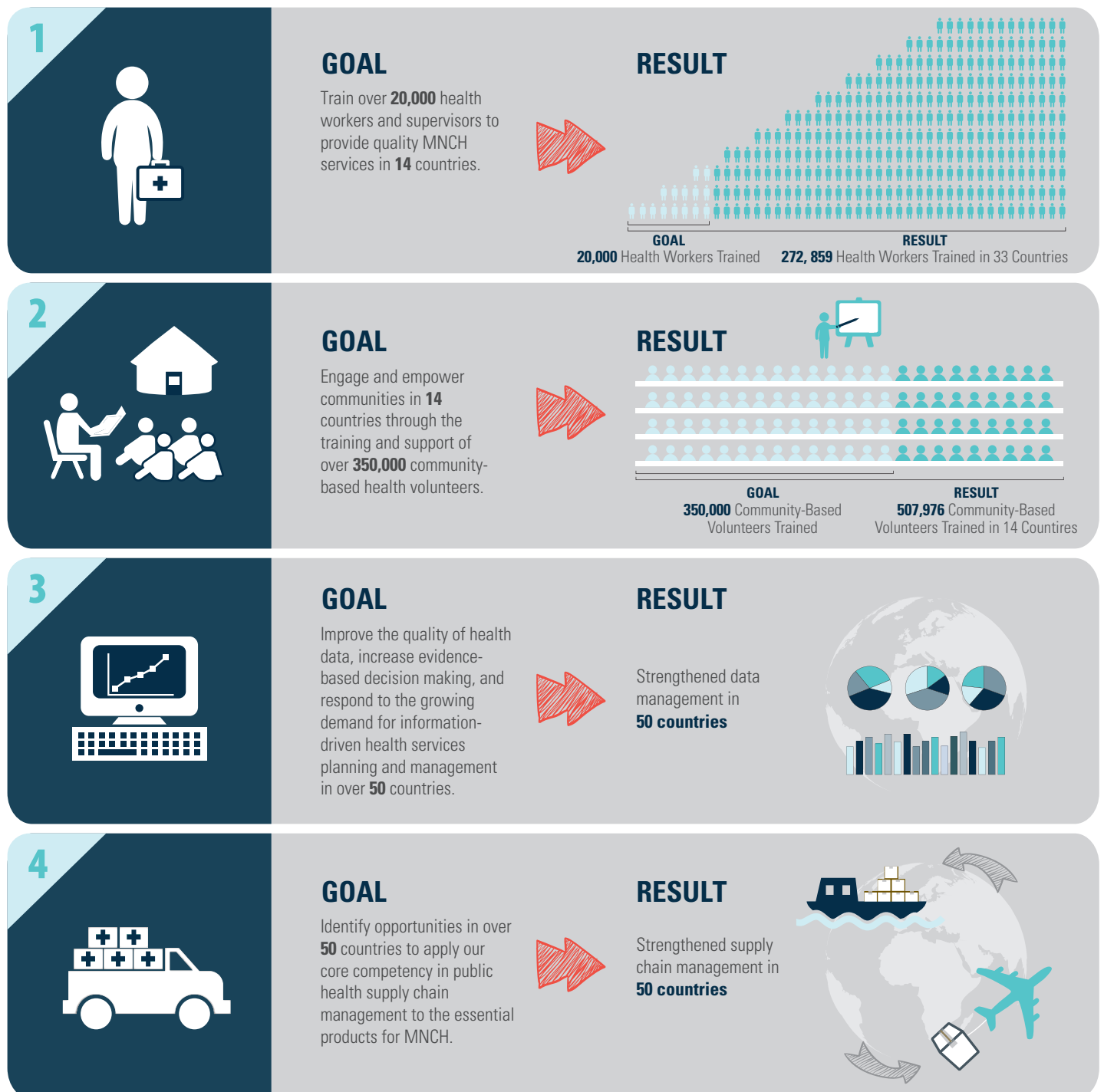


## COMMITMENTS FULFILLED: JSI Results for Every Woman Every Child

John Snow, Inc. (JSI) joined many other nongovernmental organizations and companies in pledging to support The World Health Organization's Partnership for Maternal, Newborn and Child Health (PMNCH) and the "Every Woman Every Child" campaign from 2011- 2014. With support from multilateral organizations, the U.S. government, other bilateral development assistance agencies, and private foundations. JSI assisted governments in fulfilling commitments in four areas, yielding important results:





The infographics displayed on the next few pages illustrate by region the countries where JSI provided assistance for training of health workers and community-based volunteers. JSI based its implementation approach on fully utilizing the broad reach and local capacity of ministries and communities to support a high number of trainings throughout the world.







## GOAL:

Train over **20,000 health workers** to provide quality MNCH services in **14** countries.

## RESULT:

**272,859** health workers and supervisors trained in MNCH services in **32** countries.



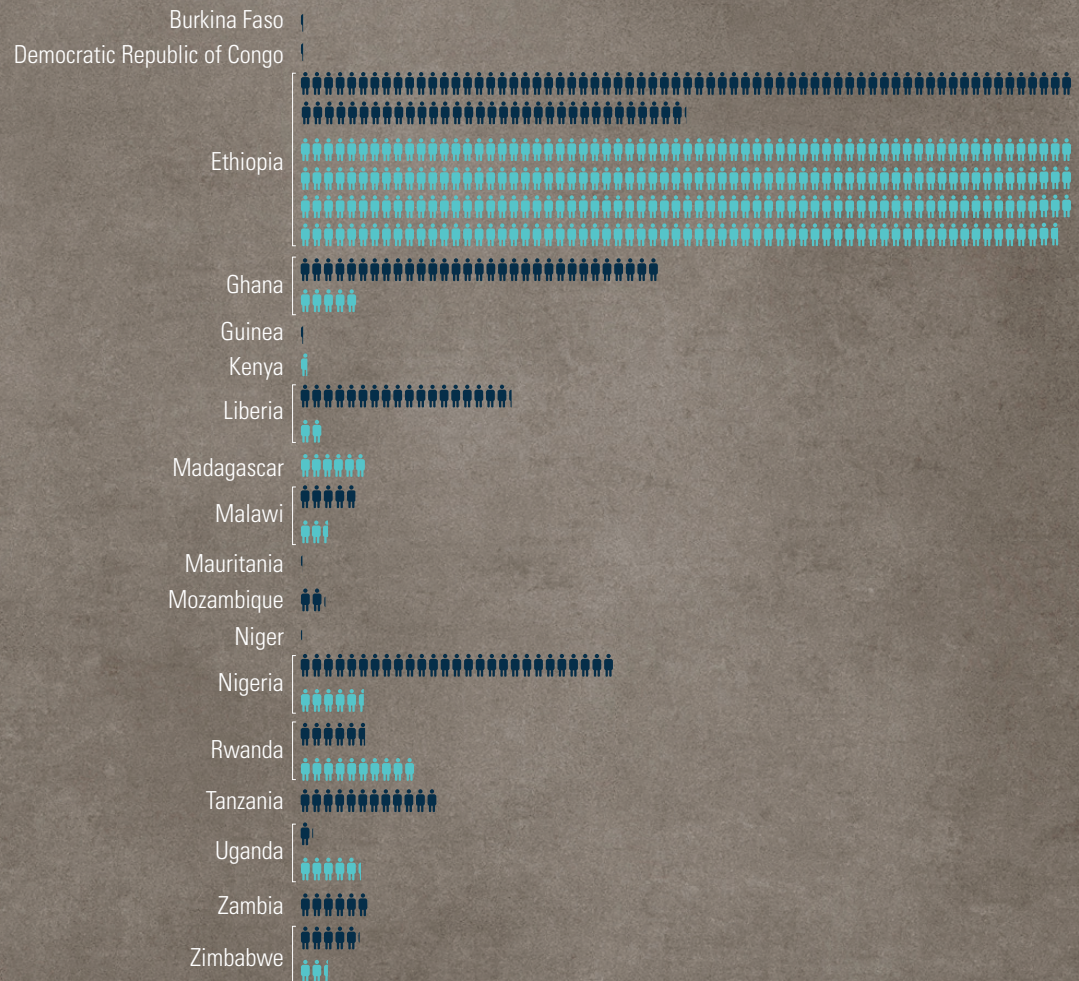
## GOAL:

Engage and empower communities in 14 countries through the training and support of over **350,000** community-based health volunteers.

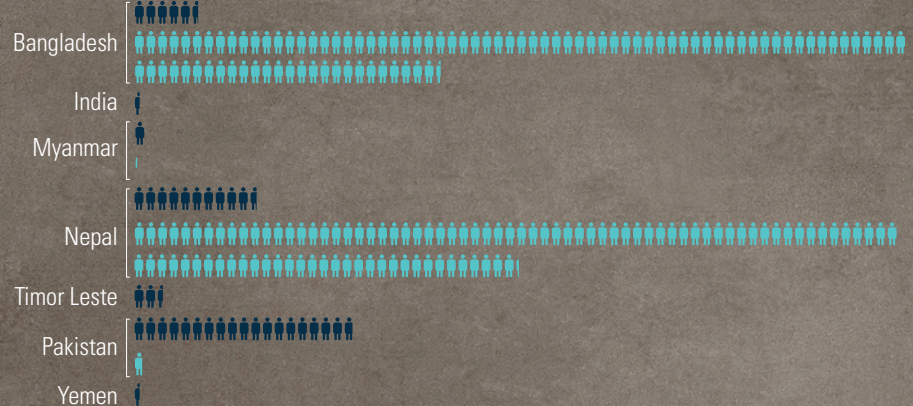
## RESULT:

**507,976** community-based volunteers trained in MNCH services in **14** countries.

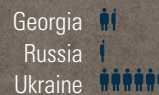

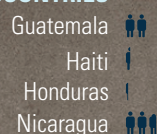

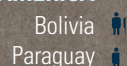

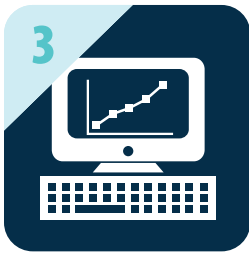

## GOAL

Improve the quality of health data, increase evidence-based decision making, and respond to the growing demand for information-driven health services planning and management in over **50** countries.

- In Ethiopia, JSI has assisted with the scale up of a reformed Health Management Information System (HMIS) in all 4,459 health facilities in SNNPR, enabling managers and care providers at all levels to produce quality data and use the information for planning and management of the health services. This has also contributed to better supervision, staff motivation, and targeting of family-oriented services.
- In South Africa, MEASURE Evaluation's Strategic Information for South Africa project is strengthening and standardizing the management of information systems from facility to national levels and has built the capacity of more than 1,750 health managers to date.



## GOAL

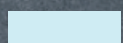
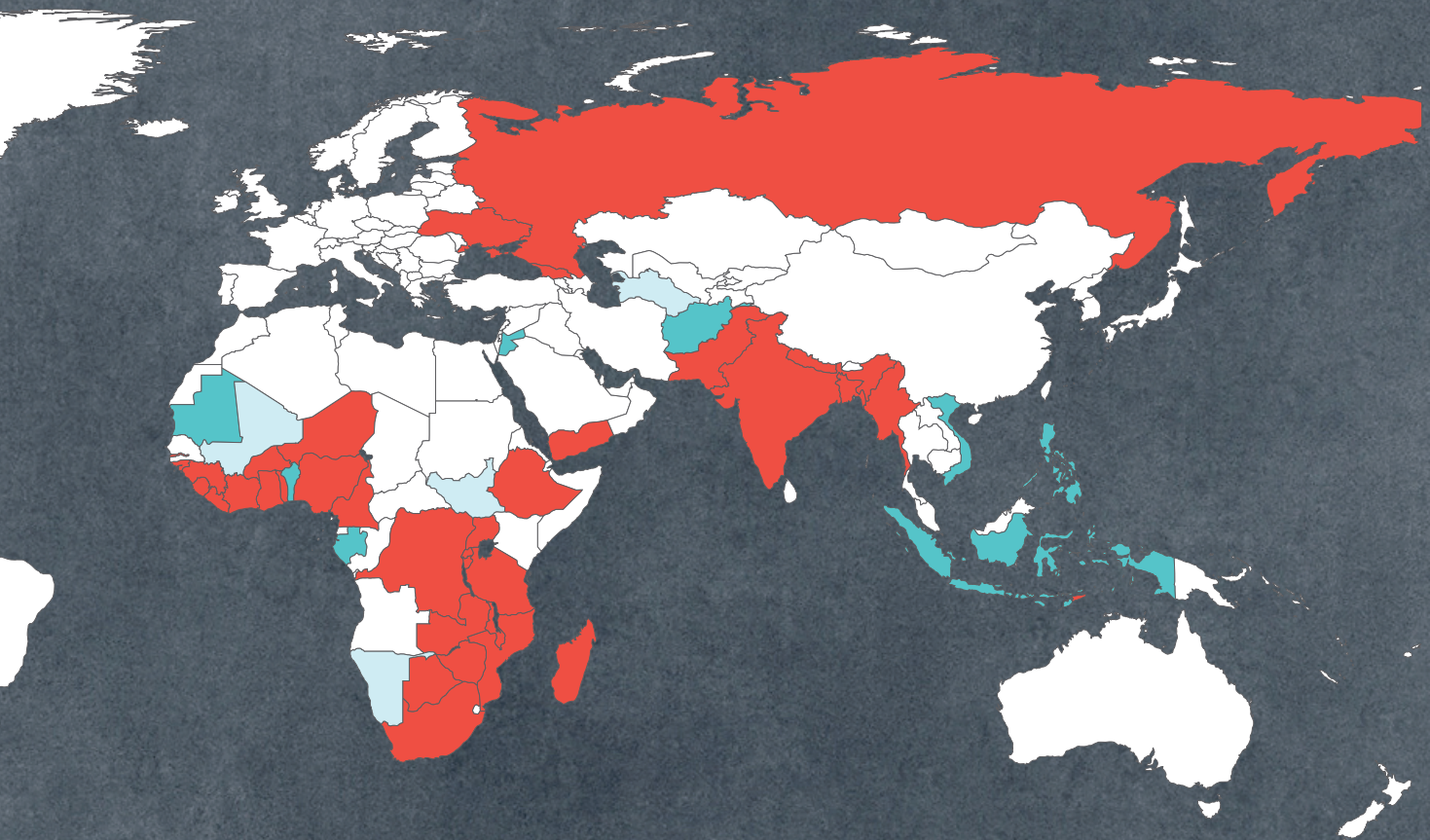
Identify opportunities in over **50** countries to apply our core competency in public health supply chain management to the essential products for MNCH.

- Since 2014, the USAID | DELIVER PROJECT has been assisting the Government of India in implementing its RMNCH+A strategy by conducting qualitative and quantitative supply chain assessments to identify bottlenecks in the supply chain, developing standard operating procedures and treatment guidelines, and training over 530 key supply chain personnel in supply chain management and logistics for RMNCH+A commodities.

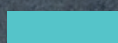




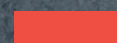

# Country Highlights

JSI's work contributed to some particularly notable results in improved MNCH services in several countries.





## Ethiopia



USAID-funded projects in Ethiopia have worked together to reach 45 million people in supporting Ethiopia's community-based approach to improving health.

JSI has been instrumental in developing Ethiopia's health supply chain through the USAID | DELIVER PROJECT and has also provided nationwide support to improve the availability of essential medicines, diagnostics, contraceptives, vaccines, and consumable supplies in public health facilities, and improved supply of all public health commodities through the Integrated Pharmaceutical Logistics System (IPLS).

## Nepal



In Nepal, JSI's introduction of chlorhexidine has reached an estimated 74% of children born in the country, with the antiseptic applied to nearly 1.3 million babies' cords and an estimated 7,200 newborn lives saved.

Since 2011, JSI and other partners have helped the government scale up chlorhexidine use to 67 of the 75 districts, and the program has influenced the design of other programs around the world. Following the 2015 earthquakes, JSI rapidly expanded chlorhexidine use and health worker training to reach 180 health facilities in all 15 affected districts.

## Nigeria



Among several projects JSI provides technical assistance and leadership in Nigeria is the Targeted States Health Improvement Project. Jama'tu Nasril Islam, the largest Islamic nonprofit in Nigeria, and TSHIP sensitized thousands of women in three Nigerian states to address the highly prevalent issue of women giving birth alone. Their efforts helped decrease the percentage of women delivering with no one present from 25% in 2008 to 1% in 2013 in Sokoto State.



JSI looks forward to supporting commitments for PMNCH's new Global Strategy for Women's, Children's and Adolescents' Health set to launch in Fall 2015. We congratulate the Ministries, partners, JSI field staff and all those who supported the Every Woman Every Child efforts in coming to fruition over the past four years.
