




USAID TRANSFORM: PRIMARY HEALTH CARE

Background

USAID Transform: Primary Health Care is a five-year (2017-2021) project implemented by Pathfinder International, JSI Research & Training Institute, Inc. (JSI), Abt Associates, EnCompass LLC, the Ethiopian Midwives Association, and Malaria Consortium. This diverse consortium brings unparalleled on-the-ground knowledge, the ability to respond effectively and quickly to challenges, and a foundation of trust with governmental and nongovernmental partners. A pool of resource partners, both Ethiopian and international, are on hand to provide technical input and innovation as new challenges and opportunities arise.

USAID Transform: Primary Health Care will:

- strengthen the management and performance of the public health system
- build the capacity of regional health bureaus to more effectively manage the way primary health care services are delivered at the woreda level, in primary hospitals, health centers, and health posts



- improve service delivery quality across the continuum of care
- improve household and community health practices and health-seeking behaviors
- enhance program learning to impact policy and programming related to prevent maternal and child deaths
